Preliminary Joint Communiqué on Long-term Low-emission Development Strategies to Inform 1.5°C-Aligned Action

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COP30: A Turning Point to focus on Climate Action

- 2025 marks the **10th anniversary of the Paris Agreement** and the midpoint of the decisive decade.
- New and updated **NDCs (to 2035)** are critical to link short-term action with long-term net-zero goals.
- 60 net-zero targets, LT-LEDs covering 74% of global emissions — **ambition gaps remain**.
- Today's emissions levels off track for Paris Agreement goals, but most importantly, enablers of transformative emissions not necessary in place – **implementation gap grows (and could grow faster)**.
- Brazil's COP30: opportunity to **rebuild trust** and drive **implementation-focused cooperation**.

The Role of LT-LEDS: Turning Pledges into Progress

- Help translate 1.5°C target into national pathways and connect short- and long-term planning.
- LTS = national frameworks aligning climate + development goals.
- Strengthen institutions, inter-ministerial coordination, and stakeholder inclusion.
- Enable long-term investment signals, just transitions, and identification of international support needs.

The '2050 Is Now' Call to Action for COP30 on LT-LEDS role

- Acknowledge progress on LT-LEDS and call for the 3rd LT-LEDS Synthesis Report by COP31
- Encourage updates and new LT-LEDS aligned with 1.5°C, just transitions, and adaptation goals.
- Encourage Parties to use LT-LEDS to explain how their the level of alignment of NDCs align with long-term goals, as well as explore avenues for further ambition . For instance, as part of existing review mechanisms, such as the facilitative multilateral consideration of progress, and in future dialogues on ambition
- Integrate use of LTS processes with other national planning and dialogues, including for sectoral pathways
- Requesting Parties to use LT-LEDS development processes to identify the challenges and barriers, global enabling conditions, and specific international cooperation needed to support implementation s that are necessary for countries to implement climate action in line with long-term goals.
