1. Main objective

To support the finalisation of a scientifically robust country-level DDP scenario through peer-to-peer exchanges, cross-country comparisons and collective discussion on key global enabling conditions (global narratives) and to set the foundations for the upcoming country-level policy analysis and engagement work.

2. Specific objectives

Scenario development:

1. To provide final review comments to the First DDP scenario
2. To identify variants of this first DDP scenario that may culminate in an alternative DDP scenario or an enhanced sensitivity analysis in views to increase the robustness of final policy recommendations – including variants based on the Global Narrative work
3. To further develop the Global Narratives framework and its future research agenda
4. To consolidate sectoral deep dives for first DDP scenario (transport, AFOLU, power) and workplan for industry work

Policy and stakeholder engagement:

5. To agree on a common approach to policy analysis and reporting
6. To take stock on country priorities for engagement based on scenario results
7. To discuss jobs analysis proposal at international and domestic levels
8. To discuss and validate the international engagement strategy for 2021
9. To advance on tools & resources that can support policy engagement: communication and data visualisation

Country sessions seek to provide a safe space to reflect on the overall results of the emerging DD scenario to potentially enhance its robustness in the eyes of the domestic stakeholders, academic and international communities. Discussions will seek to better understand the stories behind the numbers, the coherence across sectors, its Paris-compatibility and the type of engagements that will benefit from this new piece of evidence. Required Inputs	- Country team presentation: <i>Content:</i> With DD scenario results at hand, we invite each country team to make a step back and reflect on the overall outcome. To this, we call on		

teams to prepare an intervention that directly responds to the following guiding questions:

1. How does the DD scenario pave the path to zero emissions and basic welfare of all at national level “in the second half of the century”?
2. What are the assumptions in your DD scenario that you would consider less robust (either because they face intrinsic uncertainties or because you would expect them to be critically questioned by stakeholders)?
3. What are the key international enablers of your DD scenario?
4. What are the two specific transformations that you would prioritise for the purpose of your policy and stakeholder engagement work, and why?

When preparing question nr. 4, the following arguments may help informing the selection of only two key transformations among a potential longer list:

- Mitigation abatement over time
- Role as enabler for other actions to happen (role model, physical enabler, trigger technology development, etc.)
- Potential to avoid lock-ins, reduce cost to deep decarbonisation, etc.
- Critical role to make zero emissions possible
- Novelty in the evidence generated, i.e there is new information (more granular, more up-to-date) that can debunk old myths, provide new avenues for action, increase understanding of required action, etc.
- Opportunity to contribute to an actual political /political economy ongoing debate/process (legislation development, recovery plans, existing conflict, etc.)
